

3. SOUTHERN REGION BRANCH REPORTS

The Southern Region now has a total fourteen (14) Branches. With the latest being Nampundwe which was approved to be opened by Council in December, 2022. 1.	Resolutions from Branch Executive Quarterly meetings	 EIZ secretariat must endeavour to involve branch executive members in compliance activities that occur within their branches. Queries raised on social media platforms such as Facebook/WhatsApp Groups to be addressed with the importance/urgency they need. All branches participated in the African Engineering week, whose activities included panel discussions, tree planting, motivational talks at trade schools and a minimum of 2 career talks both in the rural and urban areas of their respective areas. Most branches have formed working relationships with industrial partners in the branches, these include Zambia Sugar PLC, Maamba Collieries, Local City Councils, ZESCO branches, Nitrogen Chemicals Zambia etc.

The secretariat had conducted compliance registration in most parts of the region, visiting organizations and units, universities, technical colleges and trade schools. These compliance inspections also included membership registrations and renewals.

During the year under the review:

- 1. Membership and inspectorate units inspected a total number of 2,560 Organisations and units.
- 2. Registered a total of 2,145 new members on the database
- 3. Registered a total number of 577 students on our database.
- 4. Achieved a compliance rate of 75% for Individual Engineering Professionals and 86% for Engineering Organisations and Units.

Within the year, secretariat managed to visit all the provincial centres in Lusaka, Central, Eastern, Western, and Southern Provinces
